

Key Knowledge:

- Shabbat is a special day of rest for Jewish people.
- Shabbat begins on Friday at dusk and finishes on Saturday at dusk every week.
- During Shabbat, Jewish people spend time with family and friends, eat meals and think about God.
- To prepare for Shabbat, Jewish families do their shopping and cooking in advance, clean their house, put money into a pushke (charity), pray and light Shabbat candles.
- Jewish people do not work during Shabbat because God rested after he had made the world.
- The synagogue is the Jewish place of worship.
- The synagogue brings Jewish people together to pray to God, for teaching, to meet others and to celebrate special occasions.
- Inside a synagogue there is a Rabbi, a Ner Tamid, a prayer room, a bimah, a cantor, a menorah and an ark.
