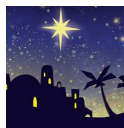


Key Knowledge

- Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh.
- They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
- The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' – a Messiah.
- The book of Isaiah points towards a future Messiah.
- The book of Matthew references Jesus as being the Messiah.
- Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations, and that he is the Messiah.
- Jewish people do not think Jesus is the Messiah.
- Christians see Jesus as their Saviour.
