- Christians believe that Jesus was a peacemaker.
- The Transfiguration teaches Christians about Jesus' character and person as the Son of God..
- Different artists have represented the Transfiguration and ideas about the Messiah..
- There are different views of Jesus in Bible times and today..
- The Old Testament pieces together the story of the People of God. As their circumstances change (for example, from being nomads (Abraham, Jacob) to being city dwellers (David)), they have to learn new ways of following God.

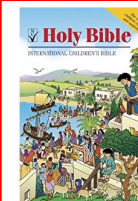
