Times Tables

Over the academic year, Year 3 will develop their knowledge of 3, 4 and 8 times tables and will consolidate their knowledge of 2, 5, and 10 times tables. It is important for children to have a good knowledge of multiplication facts as this helps in all areas of maths. In school we use Times Tables Rockstars as a fun way to practise times tables knowledge and it is therefore important that regular practise takes place.
