

## Key Knowledge Outcomes

At the end of this unit pupils will know that:

- Jesus was Jewish.
- Christians believe Jesus is God in the flesh.
- They believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
- The Old Testament talks about a 'rescuer' or 'anointed one' - a Messiah. Some texts talk about what the Messiah would be like.
- Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled these expectations and that he is the Messiah. (Jewish people do not think that Jesus is the Messiah)
- Christians see Jesus as their saviour.

## Incarnation

The New Testament presents Jesus as the answer - the Messiah and Saviour, who will repair the effects of sin and the Fall and offer a way for humans to be at one with God again. Incarnation means that Jesus is God in the flesh, and that, in Jesus, God came to live amongst humans.
